PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

It is estimated that 74,340 new cases of lymphoma will be diagnosed in the United States this year with an estimated 20,510 deaths. There will be 44,270 new cases of leukemia with 21,710 deaths, and 19,920 new cases of myeloma will be diagnosed, resulting in 10,690 deaths. Advances in treatment have increased survival rates, and using existing drugs in new ways have extended therapeutic options. The Annual Meeting of the American Society of Hematology (ASH) is a forum for discussion of new, cutting-edge treatment of hematologic malignancies and other hematologic disorders. This program is designed to help physicians in their practice by bringing state-of-the-art information on the management of hematologic cancers and disorders to local oncologists and hematologists who were unable to attend the 2008 Annual Meeting of ASH. The latest research data and new treatment options for leukemia, lymphoma, myeloma, stem cell procedures, and platelet and clotting disorders will be discussed. We will explore the role of novel therapeutics in the management of patients with hematologic cancers and disorders. We will address new developments in a broad range of hematologic topics.

OBJECTIVES

It is expected that after attending this program, participants should be able to:

1. describe advances in the management of hematologic disorders and cancers;
2. identify new strategies for optimizing existing treatments in these patients;
3. evaluate new therapeutic options for treatment of these patients; and
4. review new developments in hematologic research and clinical trials to enhance discussion with patients and referral to clinical trials.
