Cancer impacts many lives.....

Cancer might not be the number one killer, but it still packs a powerful punch. There are expected to be about 75,000 new cancer cases in Pennsylvania this year. The cost of cancer is expected to reach over \$250 billion in 2010. Cancer impacts many lives in many different ways. Most cancers are preventable and there are ways to reduce your risk of cancer.

Prevention is Important!

The saying "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure" is especially true for cancer. Cancer prevention means knowing your cancer risk and getting screened. Prevention also includes eating a healthy diet and exercising most days of the week. Cancer prevention is an important part of the cancer care continuum.

Sharing Information

It is important that the community be aware of cancer; not only to increase knowledge about the disease, but because some cancers do not have a reliable screening method for finding cancer early. The only way to treat cancer early is to be aware of the risk factors, know the screening guidelines and to see a doctor. Our goal is to educate the community and raise awareness about cancer.

What do we offer?

The Office of Health Communications and Health Disparities (HCHD) Speakers Bureau offers *free* 1 hour educational presentations to community organizations, church groups, worksites, and more. Presentations are delivered by health educators and are tailored to each audience to better meet their needs. Our topics include breast, colorectal, lung, ovarian, prostate, skin and cervical cancers. A presentation on Understanding Clinical Trials is also available.
